NPAMC

NPAMC stands for the National Partnership on Alcohol Misuse and Crime.

Formation

NPAMC was founded in 2008. On April 23, 2008, the group formed its board of directors and passed the organization's bylaws. The Inaugural Meeting was held in September of 2008.

Type of Organization

In June of 2008, NPAMC was incorporated as a nonprofit organization in Washington, D.C. NPAMC will be structured as a 501(C) 4.

NPAMC Leadership

NPAMC Bylaws require that at least 50 percent of board members are employed by nonprofit associations that represent researchers, justice, treatment professionals and/or legislators. One board member must be employed by a private company from the corrections or pharmaceutical industries and one board member must be employed by a company or business that manufactures, distributes or sells alcohol.
